George Mason Alumni Association (GMAA) Second 5-Year All-Class Reunion Weekend June 25 – 27, 2004

by Scott Sager, GMAA President All George Mason High School alumni, alumni teachers/administrators and guests are invited to attend our Second 5-Year All-Class Reunion Weekend–25-27 June. 2004 in Falls Church. Due to the overwhelming success of our first All-Class Reunion Weekend in June, 1999 (associated with the 50th Anniversary of the Falls Church City Public School System in 1949 and the 300th Tricentennial Celebration of the founding of Falls Church in 1699) your alumni association decided to begin holding reunion weekends near the end of June every five years to help support individual class reunions. As you will note in the various class articles, a number of classes are holding their individual class reunions during this weekend and we expect another very large turnout at all of our planned events. Events are:

Opening Reception Friday, 25 June from 5 p.m. – 7 p.m. Don Beyer Volvo Showroom. Free. (see invitation, right) Open House

Friday, 25 June from 7 p.m. to 10:30 p.m. at George Mason High School

• Cost is \$5.00 per person to cover costs of the Open House and to provide funding for the GMAA;

 \cdot Classes from the 1950's and 1960's should enter the school at the entrance in front of the old gym where tables will be set up for each class year to register;

• Classes from the 1970's, 1980's, 1990's, and 2000's should enter the school at the entrance facing Route 7 near the library (media center), school office, and auditorium;

• Individual name tags will be provided with different colors indicating alumni, alumni teachers/ administrators, and guests;

Handicap parking will be available near the Middle School entrance on the Haycock Road side of the school;
Parking will be available within the school area (including the university building adjacent to GM) as well as in the Metro Parking lot (located a short distance down Haycock Road) and is free if you leave after 10:00 p.m. and if you do leave prior to 10 p.m. the cost is \$3.00.

• Individual classes will have the option of setting up an area in the school as a class focal point. Classes from 1953 - 1970 will be using the old gym, and classes from 1971 -2003 will be using the new gym;

Class Gift Presentation at Friday Open

House: The Classes of 1953 & 1954 will present a painting of the Thompson House as a class gift to the school at 8:30 p.m. in the auditorium. Accepting on behalf of George Mason High School, will be Mary Ellen Shaw, Superintendent of the Falls Church City Public Schools. The Thompson House, located at Seven Corners, housed future GM students during the 1951-52 school year while awaiting the completion of George Mason High School which opened in September 1952.

New Superintendent: Dr. Lois Berlin

The Falls Church City School Board has chosen Alexandria Associate Superintendent Dr. Lois



Berlin to become Falls Church City Public Schools' seventh superintendent.

Dr. Berlinbeganher 29-year career in education in a residential school for special needs students in Scotland where she taught middle school students and served in an administrative role. She completed her Masters degree in Early Childhood/Special Education at George Washington University and began teaching in Alexandria City Public Schools. She has served in administrative roles in Alexandria for 16 years. For the past two years, Dr. Berlin has served as Alexandria's Associate Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction.

The search for a new superintendent began with the announcement in January of the retirement of Mary Ellen Shaw who, after working for Falls Church City Public Schools her entire career, spent the last seven years serving as superintendent. The School Board began immediately soliciting candidates and seeking input from the community at town meetings to develop a description of the ideal candidate and to identify challenges facing the school division. The Board took great care considering the 35 applicants for the position, through the use of consultants, extensive interviews, and site visits to thoroughly evaluate the finalists.

An interview panel of school staff and community members interviewed four finalists who visited Falls Church. Board Chairman Ruth Brock said "I believe that we left no stone unturned. We have carried out an extensive search. We have interviewed carefully, taken careful account of the input from the interview panel, and visited the communities of our finalists. We are very pleased to present Dr. Lois Berlin to the Falls ChurchCommunity."Dr. Berlin will assume the duties of Superintendent of the Falls Church City Public Schools on July 15th.

Patti Carson and I usually share space in the newsletter; however, this time you are stuck with me while Patti is away on a USO tour, entertaining our troops in Guantanamo. How she has time to sing and dance and still do all that planning for the '53/'54/'55 reunion is truly amazing. (Just kidding, Patti).

Before reviewing some of the information that Patti (and Gail and Maggie for '55) sent you about the reunion, I wanted to take this opportunity to offer a long-overdue word of thanks to Judy Allen, Buddy Tasker's ('54) aunt, for helping us last year during the Falls Church Memorial Day Parade. Those of us who participated in the motorcade gathered at Judy's house at various times during the course of the day. I had the pleasure of meeting this gracious lady for the first time on that occasion, thanks to Buddy. Since then we have talked on the phone about the early days of the Falls Church school system and what we could piece together about the history of Thompson House. Thanks again, Judy, for all your help.

Turning to the reunion once more, this may be our last-gasp attempt to pry you away from your sedentary lives so that you can join us on June 25-27, 2004 at the Doubletree Hotel at Tyson's, 7801 Leesburg Pike, Falls Church, VA 22043 (or alternatively, the crash pad of your choice). As you may recall, Friday night, June 25th is the All-Class Reunion and Open House at

George Mason High School from 7-10:30 p.m. Parking will be tight, so consider carpooling or, better yet, taking a taxi to the festivities. At the All-Class reunion, the classes of '53-'54 will present a picture of Thompson House to the school as a class gift. The classes spent the school year of 1951-1952 at Thompson House, located at Seven Corners, while George Mason was being built after many delays caused by the shortage of materials due to the Korean War. The picture was painted by Roberta Lintner(wife of '53 classmate John), who is a noted artist.

There is no fixed itinerary for most of Saturday, June 26th, so you could spend it sightseeing, renewing old friendships, or just hanging out in the GM Hospitality Room at the Doubletree. Saturday night's major attraction is the '53/'54/'55 banquet at the Doubletree from approximately 7-10 p.m.

On Sunday morning, June 27th, many of the classmates will meet informally for brunch at the Doubletree. This will probably be the last chance to socialize in small groups. The cost of the brunch is \$9.95 plus tax (which was not covered as part of the reunion fee). On Sunday afternoon the George Mason Alumni Association is sponsoring an all-class picnic beginning at noon at Cherry Hill Park, located behind City Hall at Park Avenue and Little Falls Street. I wish there were some way to close on a less somber note, but as you probably know by now, in March we lost another classmate and wonderful friend, **Gloria** (McGillis) Stearns ('53). Many of us knew Gloria from the old days at Falls Church High School. When we were freshmen back in the fall of 1949, Gloria and I took Algebra I together from Mrs. McBee; Gloria sailed through the course while I nearly capsized. Gloria was a JV cheerleader at Falls Church and a member of the Junior Honor Society. Also, somewhere, buried in an old box amidst 60+ years of accumulated clutter of mine, is a tattered program from the Falls Church High School production of "Our Town," in which she starred.

Gloria was not part of the Thompson House adventure but rejoined our class at George Mason High School in the fall of 1952. At this point it would be difficult, if not impossible to try to recapture all the things she was and what she achieved over a lifetime cut far too short. It is difficult to put into words, but we remember her as elegant, charming, graceful, and intelligent with a keen sense of humor. Gloria always seemed to excel at everything she tried. In recent years, despite a prolonged battle with cancer and constant pain, she somehow found the time and energy to correspond with many of us back in the D.C. area. Her letters were always upbeat, often accompanied by pictures of herself, her husband Burt, and her cats.

As recently as a few months ago, Gloria still had high hopes of attending our reunion with her sister, Maryanne. When I called Gloria in December, after hearing about a recurrence of her cancer, she seemed more concerned about my wife's prolonged illness than her own. That was the last time we talked before she died. Gloria was a beautiful person in every sense of the word; and, like others who knew her well, I will always be grateful to have been her friend. We all miss you, Gloria. Goodbye and God speed, gentle friend.

Clark "It's fascinating to hear about our classmates' incredibly diverse and rich collection of accomplishments. It's a challenge to try to put my past 48 years into one paragraph, but here are some highlights: After college, I married a lawyer and moved to Californianot far from Los Angeles. Adopted five children of various nationalities as babies. Went back to graduate school(Claremont Graduate University's Peter F. Drucker School of Management) where I got an M.A. Two years later, returned for an M.B.A. Worked for Wells Fargo Bank for 25 years in various management positions. A favorite volunteer 'job' was as a 4-H leader for 15 years when the children were growing up. Had

every kind of farm animal imaginable, including a herd of 28 Nubian dairy goats. After my husband's heart attack (mild, fortunately), it just wasn't fun (or wise) to maintain the property ourselves any more. So, my husband and I both retired, sold our place, and moved to a small house near Laguna Beach. Four of our children married lateto incredibly wonderful people. Last unmarried child has just become engaged—at age 38. Children (and four grandchildren, so far) live nearby. 
