Nancy Birindelli Retires

One of the true inspirations and driving forces behind the George Mason Alumni Association retired at the end of 2003. Nancy Birindelli has been the primary liaison person between the GMAA and the City of Falls Church School System since the very beginning of the GMAA in 1988. In fact, Nancy is credited with initiating the idea of an alumni association prior to the 40th Anniversary celebration of the City of Falls Church Public Schools in 1989. For the past 15 years, Nancy has worked hand and glove with the GMAA and almost single-handedly ensured that the GMAA received the necessary funding each year from the City to keep the GMAA alive and functioning. The vast majority of these funds went into producing and mailing the Mustang Review on a twice yearly basis - not a trivial cost and absolutely necessary to maintain a current mailing database and, therefore, an active Alumni Association that does not rely on dues or subscription charges to survive financially.

Nancy began her career in Falls Church City Public Schools when she was hired to teach fourth grade at Mt. Daniel School in 1967. After leaving Mt. Daniel, she

George Mason High School Campus to Expand With a New Building for Grades 5-7

In the November 2003 elections, the electorate of the City of Falls Church overwhelmingly approved a \$25 million bond referendum to build a new school for 600

students in grades 5-7, and to add classrooms and make traffic flow improvements at Mt. Daniel. The new school will be constructed on the current George Mason High School campus, in the area of the existing tennis courts and is projected for completion by September 2005. The new school will include 10 classrooms for each grade level (30 total), a "cafetorium" which serves as a cafeteria and performance space, and a 1,000 seat gymnasium for shared use by the high school, extra-curricular sports, and the City's Recreation and Parks Department's sports programs. The addition at Mt. Daniel will include four additional classrooms, ex-



panded parking and safer traffic flow. The redistribution of grades will also provide additional space for the remaining students at GMHS and Thomas Jefferson Elementary.

This new school project was required by the fact that Falls Church's school population has grown over the last 10 years by roughly 50 percent—which is faster than several surrounding school systems. In order to meet space needs for the 2003-2004 school year, eight additional trailers were added to the 13 already located next to school buildings; together they house over 350 students or about 20 percent of the total school system enrollment.

Paul Ebert '55 Successfully Prosecutes Sniper

Muhammad, 43, in the sniper death of Dean Harold Meyers, 53, at a Manassas gas station. A Virginia Beach jury recommended in November 2003 that Muhammad be put to death for the October 9, 2002 shooting. Both John Allen Muhammad and Lee Boyd Malvo will receive formal sentences in Northern Virginia on March 10, 2004. This event is largely a formality -- Judges are not allowed to change a sentence from life in prison to death, and rarely ever reduce death sentences to life in prison.

Superintendent of Schools Announces Retirement



Superintendent Mary Ellen Shaw has announced plans to retire in June 2004. In a letter to the School Board Shaw wrote, "...hav-

ing turned the corner with the very positive vote on the referendum, it is time for a new superintendent to lead the system through the next series of important decisions and the anticipated continuing growth in enrollment." Superintendent Shaw's retirement plans include an offer to be available to help the new superintendent and administrative staff through the new school's construction process, spending time with family, as well as pursuing personal interests and continued education.

Superintendent Shaw began her career with Falls Church City Public Scholls (FCCPS) 34 years ago as a 1st grade teacher at Mt. Daniel Elementary. In 1977 she became principal of Mt. Daniel Elementary and Elementary Supervisor. During this tenure, both Thomas Jefferson and Mt. Daniel Elementary schools were recognized for excellence in education by the U.S. Department of Education. In 1989 she received the *Washington Post* Distinguished

Educational Leadership Award. followed by an appointment to Director of Instruction and Assistant to the Superintendent in 1990. She served as an interim middle school principal In 1992, and interim superintendent in 1995 and 1997. During her second service as interim superintendent, in 1997, Ms. Shaw was appointed Superintendent of FCCPS. During this notable career she has watched FCCPS student enrollment grow over 50%, weathered decreasing state funding and tight budgets, overseen the renovation of Mt. Daniel as a principal, the renovation of George

Administrator Nancy Sprague

You never have heard and you never will hear anything negative about Nancy Sprague. You never even heard of anyone secondguessing her. How rare is that in high-powered educational circles? It's a tribute to Dr. Nancy Sprague that, considering the huge number of students, parents and fellow educators she worked with on sometimes very controversial issues, her integrity was so solid that even those who might disagree with her respected her unquestioningly.

Nancy, the Chief Academic Officer for the Fairfax County Public Schools, died unexpectedly in her sleep recently. Her boss, Fairfax Superintendent Daniel Domenech, called her his "right hand." Isis Castro, chairman of the Fairfax County School Board, called Nancy the "Bionic Woman," in reference to her extraordinary work ethic and capacity for taking on large projects and completing them successfully.

While Nancy spent the last 13 years of her prestigious career in Fairfax County, which has one of the nation's largest school divisions, it was right here in little Falls Church that she laid the groundwork for her phenomenal success.

Nancy arrived in Falls Church as a member of the 1970 freshman class of teachers. It was a large, energetic group that I was proud to be a member of. That class included current Falls Church superintendent Mary Ellen Shaw, who came aboard as an elementary teacher. We (over 20 of us!) were referred to as "the rookies" and, funny as it seems now, 34 years later, we were considered "the youth movement" that would breathe new life into the schools. Very much because Nancy led the way, we did.

At first, Nancy was a high school social studies teacher. While we were both technically rookies, the difference between us was so enormous, I recognized it immediately. First of all, she had the heft of that PhD from Michigan under her belt and a quiet confidence that I immediately admired. I hung around her classes just to learn how to teach. We became fast friends and I learned much from her, especially that it was worth taking risks in the classroom. Nancy Sprague was the walking embodiment of a new and exciting pedagogy that I aspired to;

Mason MS/HS as Assistant to the Superintendent, and embarked on a innovative public/private partnership for the construction of the new 5-7 Middle School as Superintendent, while continuing to sustain the excellence of the Falls Church City's schools as a premier small public school system. In addition, Superintendent Shaw has earned the respect and admiration of the School Board members, teachers, support staff and students. The GMAA would also like to thank Mary Ellen for her very positive support of, and frequent participation in, the alumni association.

Chairman Ruth Brock stated, "The Board is meeting with a consultant who could help us spread the widest possible recruitment net, and assist us with other specific services. However, the Board feels strongly that this is our job and we will not be turning the project largely over to a search firm."

The School Board will hold community and staff meetings to

it combined the best of the traditional and the experimental. I also found out that she and her wonderful husband Stephen were



phenomenal poker players, but that's a story for another time.

Most of all Nancy reinforced in all of her fellow teachers the idea that every single student had an intrinsic value and that our job was to prop up that value, no matter how damaged it may be, and instill in that child a sense of worth. That was the essence of education according to the Sprague philosophy. It's the best lesson that this once-young teacher ever learned.

It soon became apparent to everyone that Nancy's intellect, grasp of educational principles, and exceptional organizational skills were needed in larger forums and she was repeatedly tapped for other assignments. She became assistant high school principal, middle school principal, K-12 director of instruc-

tion, assistant to the superintendent, and clerk of the school board.


But Nancy didn't care about titles. She was the ultimate doer. She simply liked to get things done well. She had an abiding faith in the democratic concept of public schools and was committed to making that concept a reality for all. She was particularly concerned about students who were on the edge, who were not as enfranchised as others. She believed that school systems should deliver educational justice for everyone. She once told me that her job was to see that this justice was delivered equitably.

I believe that is why Nancy chose to work in Fairfax County even though she potentially had an exceptionally bright future assured for her in Falls Church. Once, when I asked her about her decision to move to Fairfax County back in the early 90s, she said that several factors had influenced her decision. One was that she knew Falls Church would be in good hands. Another was that she relished the idea of seeing if she could make a

difference on a larger stage. Mentally she surveyed the tens of thousands of students and the thousands of teachers in Fairfax County and said, "I want to see if I can make a real difference for so many."

Superintendent Domenech called Nancy a "visionary" and that she was. She could see the big picture clearly when the rest of us were still trying to get it into focus. Everyone who knew her can attest to Nancy's phenomenal intellect, one so tangible that it seemed like it was sitting in the chair next to her. In spite of Nancy's incredibly demanding career, she always had

time and devotion for her family, friends and community. She was very active in her church, Dulin United Methodist, and took time for everyone. We all suffered with her and Stephen when they lost their precious daughter Beth three years ago. Shortly after that, Nancy encountered serious health problems and so did Stephen. Yet, in spite of her pain, she seemed unfazed by life's adversities. When I asked her how she did it, she said, "Michael, there is no alternative but to carry on." And so we shall, without her, but also because of her.



Lights For GM's Football Field

trying, it now appears that lights, yes lights, will finally be built at

the Mustangs Football field! An aggressive campaign to raise money to light the George Mason High School athletic field scored a major breakthrough because of GM alumni, Jacques Joseph (Joey) Moore III '99, who starred in football and baseball at GMHS. Joey has used his new position as

vice president at Moore Cadillac in Tysons Corner to negotiate a deal with the George Mason Boosters Club that gives the car dealership "naming rights" to the football field at GM in exchange for a major donation that, effectively, puts the fundraising effort "over the top." According to the Falls Church News-Press. Moore, who received his bachelor's degree from The Citadel before joining his grandfather's auto business and rising rapidly to the position of vicepresident, said that he was grateful for the role that athletics played for him at George Mason and that they

were an important part of maintaining his interest in school.

In exchange for the Moore Cadillac contribution (\$50,000 according to the *Washington Post*). the football field at GM will be officially known as Moore Cadillac Stadium for five years and will be part of the overall Jack Gambill Athletic Fields.

Also, according to the *Post*, the selling of naming rights to high school stadiums is rare, and several athletic directors from around the area indicated that they wished they could strike similar deals for their athletic facilities.


